In the beginning, a group of like-minded Belgian Shepherd Dog enthusiasts sat down with pen and paper and a list of names and addresses provided by the Canine Control Council of Queensland (Dogs Queensland pre-privacy law days).

Letters were hand written (this was before the use of personal computers or desktop printers) to owners of each and every Belgian Shepherd Dog registered in Queensland, as well as interstate.
